DRC GOLF DAY 2022






VALE RAY HORSBURGH OAM

The EFC has lost one of its most passionate respected members. Ray passed away after a fall while on an overseas business trip in July 2022. He joined the Essendon Football Club Board in 2003, served as President from 2005-2009 and was a passionate supporter with a great understanding of the game. Ray had extensive involvement with the EFC administration and the playing group, he provided

endless corporate support and was a significant benefactor.

Ray was a wonderful Club man, EFC Life member, member of the Collins Street Dons, the Essendonians, EFC First XVVIII, Coleman Club, Dick Reynolds Club Trustee of the EFC Past Players & Officials Association. He was involved in the VFL administration with suburban and country football, along with the Williamstown Seagulls Football Integration Development Association (FIDA) team. FIDA is an Australian football competition for players with intellectual disabilities.



Ray was a mentor to many and gave unheralded support to so many people. He never chased the limelight or recognition for the assistance he provided to so many in all walks of life. Ray had an impressive business career as the CEO of ACI and then Smorgon Steel Pty Ltd. He had immense personal contacts across the broader business network and had a life time of community and charitable involvement which was recognised by his OAM award.

He was a larger-than-life personality, who will be remembered by all of us for his enthusiasm, friendship, openness and ongoing support. Ray was a friend who will be greatly missed.

Our thoughts go to his wife Pam, his sons Andrew, Justin and Derek and daughter Johanna and their families.

It was great honour for me to be Master of Ceremonies for his Memorial service at the MCG which attracted 500 people.

NEW BOOK - COLEY'S CHAMPS

The purpose of the Dick Reynolds Club is to celebrate the success and achievements of the Essendon Football Club. Now two supporters have gone one step further and written a book about the 1962 and 1965 Premierships. It is a good read, that will appeal to all Bomber supporters interested in the history of the EFC. Two lifelong supporters, Michael Kearney and Phil Hoey from Ballarat felt there was very little media or literature on the 62 and 65 era. They had a chance meeting with Kevin Sheedy, who encouraged them to proceed with a book to record the personal stories of those ageing Premiership players. With the assistance and encouragement of those former champions, they commenced their planning.

The basis of the book was to interview all the players of the 1962 and 1965 Premierships. Michael Phil said it was the humility, candor plus the overall enthusiasm of the former players which was heart warming and confidence boosting for the authors.

The book provides first hand recollections and memories of those playing years. It includes interviews with over 40 players and their families over a period of two and a half years. The foreword is written by Kevin Sheedy who was keen to see the EFC history remembered. He believes it is important that the personal stories of those players are recorded.

This will be a great opportunity to celebrate the success of the "Baby Bombers", an exciting era for the Essendon Football Club. Several of the players won a Premiership at a young age then went on to have celebrated careers. Bomber Thompson was Captain and Kevin Sheedy was Coach. James Hird was only in his second year as a player. Other notable players just starting their careers were; Mark Mercuri, Ricky Olarenshaw, Dustin Fletcher, Paul Hills, David Calthorpe, Joe Misiti and Gavin Wanganeen who also won the Brownlow Medal that year. Veterans in the team included

Tim Watson, Peter Somerville, Dean Wallis, Sean Denham, Chris Daniher, David Grenvold, Mark Harvey, Gary O'Donnell, Darren Bewick, Paul Salmon and Michael Long who won the Norm Smith Medal in the Grand Final.

Crowd favourite Tim Watson had come back to play after a one year retirement and was pivotal to the success of the team. They finished on top of the ladder that year however in the preliminary final against the Crows, were 42 points down at half time. They went on to win in a nail biting finish by one kick. The team went on to have a comfortable win by 44 points in the Grand Final against

Carlton in front of a crowd of 96,862 spectators.
